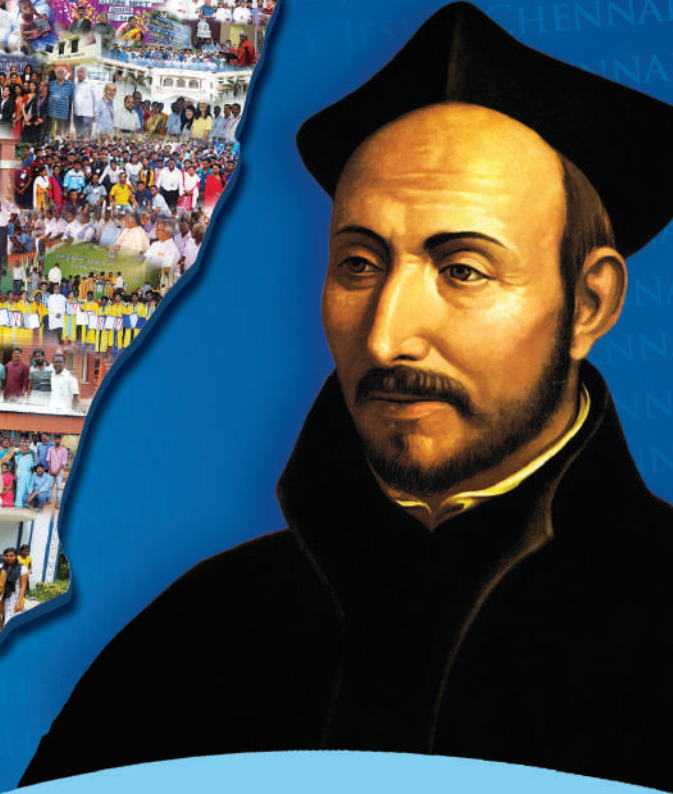

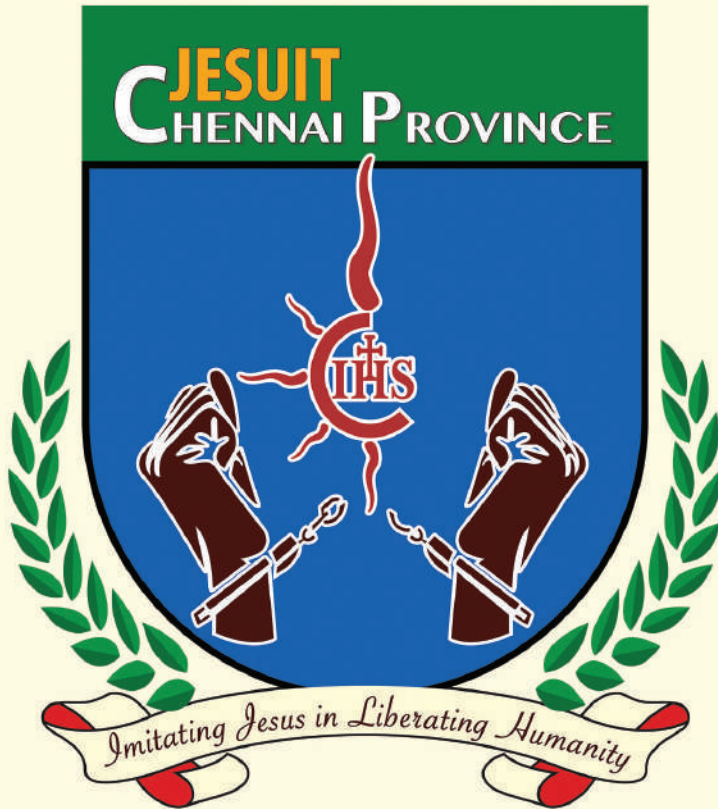

MILESTONES OF CHENNAI PROVINCE

- 1542** : St Francis Xavier arrived at the Fishery Coast.
- 1545** : He spent four months at San Thome in 'continual prayer, severe penances and long vigils' to discern the will of God.
- 1559** : Fr Alfonso Cyprian (worked from 1547) died at San Thome in the present-day Dhyana Ashram campus. Several early Jesuits of Fishery Coast and Old Madurai Mission lived in 'San Thome College'.
- 1623-88** : The Good News was announced and other centres were founded at Tiruchirappalli, Salem, Dharmapuri, (Moramangalam, Chellamangalam), Erode, Karur and Coimbatore (Sathyamangalam).
- 1648-56** : Fr Robert de Nobili lived and worked in Mylapore till his death.
- 1674-93** : St John de Britto visited Dharmapuri, the kingdom of Gingee and Pondicherry. He persuaded the French Jesuits to start the Carnatic Mission. He was the first parish priest of Kolei in Kumbakonam. He was martyred in Oryiur on 4 Feb 1693.
- 1702** : The Carnatic Mission with Pondicherry as Headquarters began, and spread around Uthiramerur.
- 1711-47** : Fr Joseph Constantine Beschi (Veeramamunivar) worked in Elakurichi, Thanjavur region, and settled in 1740 at the Coromandel Coast. He put up Adaikala Madha Shrine at Elakurichi; the Poondi Madha Church (Basilica) at Poondi; Vyagula Madha Church at Thanjavur; the Perianayagi Madha Shrine at Konankuppam.
- 1837** : After restoration of the Society of Jesus, Fr Jan Roothan, the Superior General, entrusted the Madura Mission to the care of the Jesuits of Lyons and Toulouse in France and founded the **New Madura Mission**. Four Jesuits came to Pondicherry and moved to Southern part of Tamil Nadu.
- 1925** : Loyola College was started by Fr Francis Bertram and his companions in Chennai.
- 1952** : **Madurai Province** became independent from the Province of Toulouse, France.
- 1958** : Dhyana Ashram, a spiritual animation centre, was given back to Jesuits.
- 1960** : Berchmans Illam, a house for formation, was founded at Loyola College campus, Chennai.





- 1974** : From 1974 onwards, Jesuits started working in different parishes in and around Uthiramerur namely Malligapuram, Ongur, Palliagaram and Pappanallur.
- 1979** : Arul Kadal, Regional Theologate, was established in Chennai.
- 1979** : LIBA- Loyola Institute of Business Administration was founded in Chennai.
- 1980** : The Vision of the ministries of Madurai Province became clear as 'Marching with the Marginalised'.
- 1990** : During the period of Fr Aloysius Irudayam, the then Provincial, Chengai Mission was initiated with Fr Yesumarian L as the Team Leader.
- 1990** : St John de Britto Church at Thirumanur in Kumbakonam Diocese was given to Jesuits.
- 1992** : On 18 July, inauguration of Chengai Mission and school building of Loyola Hr. Sec. School at Kuppayanallur.
- 1993** : Fr D Jeyaraj, as Provincial, sent a postulate to Fr General recommending the bifurcation of Madurai Province; but, in response to it, we were advised to develop the mission before the bifurcation.
- 1995** : Feasibility Committee headed by Fr Lourdu John made the recommendation regarding bifurcation.
- 1996** : PAATHAI - Training Centre was established at Vallam in Chengalpet.
- 1998** : Fr George C Joseph was appointed as the Animator of the Mission by the Provincial.
- 1999** : AHAL - Action for Human rights and Liberation centre was established at Kilpennathur.
- 1999** : Mother of Perpetual Help Church at Kilpennathur, Vellore Diocese was created and given to Jesuits.
- 1999** : ICRDCE - Indian Centre for Research and Development of Community Education was established in Chennai.
- 2002** : Fr Francis P Xavier, the Provincial, renamed the Chengai Mission as **Chennai Mission**.
- 2003** : Fr Jeyaraj Boniface, Rector, Loyola College, Chennai, was appointed as the Animator of the Chennai Mission.
- 2003** : DHRC - Dalit Human Rights Centre was established in Chengalpet.
- 2003** : Social Watch-TN was established in Chennai.
- 2003** : Loyola Industrial School was established in Ranipet.
- 2005** : St Joseph's Industrial School in Ooty was handed over to Madurai Province by Karnataka Jesuits.
- 2005** : IDCR - Institute of Dialogue with Cultures and Religions was established in Chennai.
- 2007** : Arrupe Illam, a spiritual animation centre, was established in Mettupalayam.



- 2007** : On 15 June, Fr Adolfo Nicolas, the Superior General, officially promulgated the creation of Chennai Mission and appointed Fr Victor Arulappan as its first Mission Superior having his own consult. An office was set up for the Chennai Mission at the Loyola College premises.
- 2007** : The First Chennai Mission Assembly put forth the mission strategy: Educate - Employ - Empower
- 2007** : Loyola College of Education was established in the Loyola College campus, Chennai.
- 2007** : Fr Ceyrac's ministries around Tindivanam were handed over to Jesuit Chennai Mission.
- 2009** : Loyola College of Arts and Science at Vettavallam was established.
- 2009** : The Second Chennai Mission Assembly emphasized that 'marching with the marginalised' is the war cry for the liberation of the marginalised.
- 2010** : LICET – Loyola-ICAM College of Engineering and Technology was founded at Loyola Campus, Chennai.
- 2011** : JMAADD - Jesuit Ministry to Alcohol And Drug Dependents was initiated in Kuppayanallur.
- 2011** : Mother Teresa Women Empowerment Centre was started at Pondicherry.
- 2011** : Loyola Academy (CBSE) was established in Vademelpakkam.
- 2011** : St Antony the Hermit Church at Makkampalayam, Ootacamund Diocese, was handed over to Jesuits.
- 2013** : Fr Jebamalai Irudayaraj L was appointed as the second Mission Superior by Fr General.
- 2013** : PARAN - Pedagogy and Action for Rights of Adivasis in North Tamil Nadu was started at Makkampalayam.
- 2014** : The Third Chennai Mission Assembly gave the direction to start new apostolic activities.
The 'Roles and Responsibilities of Chennai Mission Superior' was approved by Fr General.
- 2014** : JESIM - Jesuit Irular Mission was started at Tindivanam.
- 2014** : JMMEEx - Jesuit Migrant Ministry External was initiated.
- 2014** : JMS – Jesuit Migrants Service (Internal) was initiated.
- 2014** : LiSoR - Loyola Institute of Social Research was established in Loyola College, Vettavalam.
- 2014** : Apostolic Home started functioning in Kuppayanallur.
- 2015** : Postulate recommending the creation of Chennai Region was sent to Fr General by the Province Congregation.





- 2015** : Loyola College of Arts & Science was established in Mettala.
- 2015** : Loyola Skill Development Centre was inaugurated at Allalapatti, Harur.
- 2016** : During the period of Fr Sebastia L Raj as Provincial, the Silver Jubilee of the Chennai Mission was celebrated. The inauguration of the Jubilee was held in the premises of the graves of Frs Maxmilien de Courbeville and Pierre Maudit at Karuveppampoondi near Uthiramerur.
- 2016** : St Joseph's Church at Porulur, Coimbatore Diocese was handed over to Jesuits.
- 2017** : As a response to the postulate of 2015, Fr General directed Fr Danis Ponniah, the Provincial, to take up the discernment process with regard to the future of Chennai entity.
- 2017** : TECH Loyola was started at Loyola College campus, Vettavallam.
- 2018** : Pre-Novitiate for Chennai Mission was inaugurated at Kasthambadi and center for JMMEx was established there.
- 2019** : Sacred Heart Church, St Anne's Primary School, St Mary's Hr Sec School and Boys and Girls hostels at Harur, Dharmapuri Diocese were handed over to Jesuits.
- 2019** : Don Bosco Church at Kuppayanallur, Chingleput Diocese, was created and given to Jesuits.
- 2019** : On 18 September, Fr General declared the establishment of the Jesuit Chennai Province.
- 2019** : On 26 November, Fr Arturo Sosa, Superior General, appointed Fr Jebamalai Irudayaraj L as the first Provincial of Jesuit Chennai Province. The Chennai Province comprises of the nine ecclesiastical dioceses of the Northern and Western parts of Tamil Nadu, namely Madras-Mylapore, Pondy-Cuddalore, Chingleput, Vellore, Kumbakonam, Salem, Dharmapuri, Coimbatore and Ootacamund.
- 2019** : On 28 December, Fr Jebamalai Irudayaraj L was installed as the first Provincial of the new Chennai Province.
- 2020** : ARCALI - Accompaniment for the Rights of Coastal Areas through Leadership Initiatives was initiated at Paramankeni.
- 2020** : AHAL Skill Development Centre was established in Kilpennathur.
- 2020** : JESIM - Jesuit Irular Mission at Tindivanam was renamed as PALAVAI - Pedagogy and Action for Livelihood, Availing Entitlements, Village Leadership and Advocacy of Irulars.
- 2020** : Loyola Skill Development Centre in Harur was renamed as LIFT - Loyola Integral Formation and Training centre.
- 2020** : The First Province Day was celebrated on 28 Dec 2020.

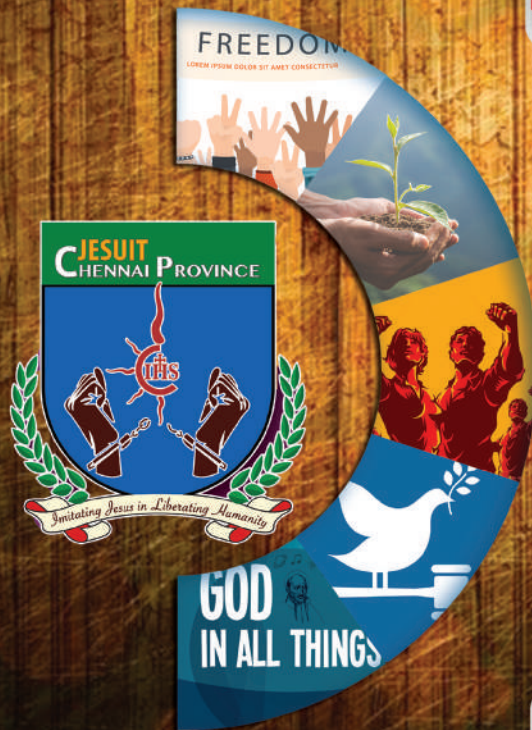

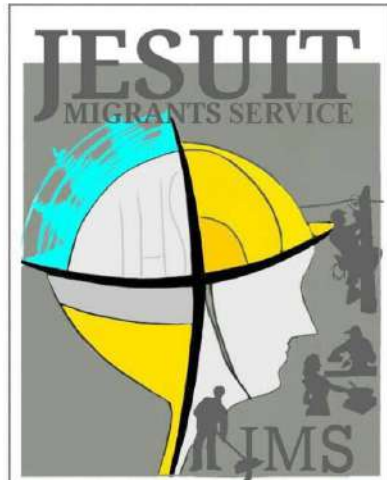

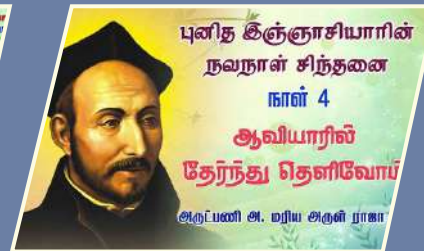
